



IS THE 5280 FELLOWSHIP FOR ME?

As potential candidates consider the 5280 Fellowship, they often ask about the personal characteristics of participants. What makes a good fellow? What types of people will I learn alongside? What should I know before committing to the program?

Successful past participants of the 5280 Fellowship have shared many of the following characteristics.

BACKGROUND

Fellows participate in the program for a variety of reasons; primarily:

- Desiring a greater sense of meaning or purpose for their career;
- Wanting greater affirmation or resourcing of their work within their faith community;
- Desire for relational connection with thoughtful Christians and professionals; and
- Longing to be more intentional, integrated, and practical within their faith and professional life.

DEMOGRAPHICS

Most fellows fall within the following broad categories:

- Early- to mid-career;
- Ages ranging from late 20s to late 40s;
- Confident in the type of work they should be doing, but often desiring deeper reflection on their specific role or contribution; and
- Have a current or future opportunity for influence or leadership within their organization.



—SPIRITUALITY—

Fellows should exhibit:

- Affirmation of the Nicene Creed;
- A mature relationship with Jesus grown from past discipleship and mentorship opportunities;
- An openness to new perspectives on spiritual formation and mission; and
- The ability to listen to and dialogue with other participants from a variety of political, professional, and cultural backgrounds.

—RELATIONALLY—

The 5280 Fellowship creates a tight network of participants, with value generated from discussing ideas in small groups and learning in larger groups. Consequently, fellows should exhibit:

- Strong emotional and relational intelligence;
- Enjoyment of reading and discussing ideas with others;
- The ability to both consider big-picture ideas and work them out through personal application;
- The discipline to self-manage and follow through on commitments; and
- The desire for a broader professional network of like-minded Christians in the Denver metro area
